The Official Opening Celebration for the new Town of Richmond Hill Wing was held on Thursday, March 26, 2009. Mayor Dave Barrow together with former Mayor Bill Bell, current councillors and hospital representatives cut the ceremonial ribbon and unveiled the plaque commemorating the Town of Richmond Hill's \$10 million transformational gift. The new north wing is a significant part of the largest redevelopment and expansion project York Central Hospital has undertaken since opening the doors in 1963. A segment of the opening celebration included ceremonies for donors to the Intensive Care Unit on Level 5 generously

funded by The Volunteer Association of York Central Hospital and the Paul B. Helliwell Foundation Inpatient Care Unit on Level 3.

"This truly is a community project, built by the community for the people in the community. To all of the donors to the Town of Richmond Hill Wing who shared our vision, believed in the project when it was in its infancy and trusted us with the financial resources to make it a reality, you have our heartfelt gratitude. It is through the partnerships and combined efforts of generous donors, municipal, regional and provincial governments, hospital administration, physicians, staff, and

volunteers that we are here celebrating this momentous occasion," said Nancy Coxford, Chair, York Central Hospital Foundation.

The Intensive Care Unit has 22 private patient care rooms, a family quiet room and a family lounge all designed to increase comfort, privacy and confidentiality for patients and their families. Patient rooms are outfitted with a dialysis station and the most up-to-date equipment.

The Paul B. Helliwell Foundation Inpatient Care Unit has 34 new beds in 19 patient care rooms including four isolation rooms to aid in infection control, a family quiet room and family/patient lounge. The entire unit has Cardiac Telemetry capabilities and is home to the Coronary Care Unit.

Both units are equipped with state-of-the-art technology that will assist the hospital's dedicated team of professionals as they deliver compassionate and expert care. Patients will begin occupying rooms in the Intensive Care Unit and the Paul B. Helliwell Foundation Inpatient Unit in April 2009. Donors' gifts will positively impact the residents living in southwest York Region for generations to come.

The Town of Richmond Hill Wing is also home to The Nick and Rosanne Cortellucci Family Emergency Department and the new and expanded York Region Chronic Kidney Disease Program.

In 2003, when the Town of Richmond Hill pledged their gift, it was the largest made by a municipality to a community hospital in all of Canada. The gift was made possible from a special community enhancement fund, created from the sale of its hydro utility and acknowledges the work of Richmond Hill Hydro Commissioners and staff over the years. It demonstrates the Town of Richmond Hill's commitment to building and maintaining a healthy community.

Mental Health Inpatient Unit

To honour the memory and celebrate the life of James Peek, a much loved son, brother, grandson, nephew and friend, family and friends gather for the *James Peek Memorial Golf Classic* held annually on June 30, James' Birthday. In nine years, the tournament has **raised more than \$160,000 for the Mental Health Program at York Central Hospital.**

On February 12, 2009 York Central Hospital unveiled a new Mental Health Inpatient Unit. Located on the third floor of the Langstaff Wing, the unit has 25 inpatient beds, including four intensive care beds with the capability of establishing and maintaining a secure environment as well as a Lounge/Dining Room.

"Roughly 3% of the population will experience a serious mental illness and another 17% will experience mild to moderate illness in their lifetime. The full range of services must be available to address the needs of people affected by these illnesses. The new unit will go a long way in providing a comfortable and safe

treatment environment for many of these patients," said Dr. Peter Zelina, Chief and Clinical Director of Mental Health Services.

The hospital's dedicated team of professionals is committed to providing the highest possible quality of care for people with mental health and addiction issues in our community. Care is tailored to the individual needs of patients by a multi-disciplinary team including: crisis intervention workers, nurses, occupational

therapists, pharmacists, psychiatrists, social workers and behavioural consultants.

The new inpatient unit is the most recent step in the hospital's journey to continually improve services for patients at York Central Hospital. Last summer, York Central was designated a Schedule One Facility which means health care professionals can help involuntary patients suffering from more complex mental illnesses closer to their homes and loved ones.

Later this year, York Central will introduce its new Day Program dedicated to short-term therapy. The Day Program will allow clients to receive therapy while living at home and maintaining their independence in the community. ■

YCH mourns the loss of a good friend

It was with deep sadness that we learned of the passing of long time friend and supporter of York Central Hospital, Ernest Redelmeier. He passed away peacefully on January 22, 2009 with family at his side.



Raised in Amsterdam, Ernest and his family immigrated to Canada in 1938, where shortly thereafter his father purchased what would become known as Don Head Farms. During World War II Ernest was a pilot in the Dutch East Indies Air Force and fought in the Pacific theatre. After returning from the war, he and his brother Francis assumed the management of the farm. It gained an international reputation for its Aberdeen Angus and Jersey cattle, and Southdown sheep, winning many prizes at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair and the Chicago International Stock Exhibition.

Ernest played an important role in the history of York Central Hospital. He was one of the original members of the York Central Hospital Association that worked so hard to bring a hospital to southern York Region. When it came time to purchase the land on which the hospital now stands, it was the Redelmeier family that agreed to sell their land to the Association at a discounted price. To avoid a conflict of interest, Ernest resigned from the Association but never wavered in his support for the Hospital.

Over the years, Ernest and his wife Flavia, graciously hosted several hospital functions in their home. They helped fund priority projects such as the hospital's first Digital Mammography Machine and both the Acute Care Zone and Treatment Zone in the new Emergency Department. His passion and support for the hospital lives on through a legacy gift, generously designated in his will.

Ernest was dedicated to his community and served on many boards such as the York Central District High School Board, the Art Gallery of Ontario, Rotary Club of Richmond Hill, Ontario Agricultural Association, Ontario Aberdeen Angus Association and the Royal Canadian Institute.

In September 2008, Ernest celebrated his 90th birthday with wife Flavia, sons Hugh and Bill, family and many friends at the family's Southbrook winery in Niagara-on-the-Lake. This warm and humorous gentleman will be missed by us all. ■

ASK AN EXPERT

What are the benefits of a routine colonoscopy?

The goal of a colonoscopy is to find any problems that could explain the symptoms a patient is experiencing or, more routinely, to look for polyps or colon cancer. Colonoscopy is a medical procedure in which a Gastroenterologist delicately guides a long thin, flexible tube through the entire 5 feet length of the colon. This is done in either a hospital or clinical setting; patients are offered sedation. Colon cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths in Canada, with Ontario having the highest incident of colon cancer in the world. Although this is terrible news for us who live in Ontario, we do have ways to minimize our risk.

Everyone should participate in the colon screening process at age 50. This applies to both men and women whether or not they have any symptoms. Many patients with colon cancer do not have any symptoms. Very few have symptoms such as change in bowel patterns, constipation, diarrhea, blood in stool, weight loss, nausea, abdominal pain, fatigue or anemia.

It is important to have regular colonoscopies. It takes approximately 7 to 8 years for the lining of the colon wall to mutate towards colon cancer. Before cancer forms, the mutated cells form a colon polyp. Polyps are pre-cancerous lesions that are easily removed during a colonoscopy thereby preventing colon cancer from occurring.

The colon is full of many folds that can easily hide small polyps. For this reason I usually suggest that my patients have a colonoscopy every 5 to 7 years, unless we have found a polyp. Patients who should get a colonoscopy earlier are those who have: a family history of colon cancer; a history of a colon polyp on a previous colonoscopy; or developed symptoms relating to their bowels.

If you feel you are one of these patients, please talk to your family doctor who can refer you to our team of experts at York Central Hospital. ■

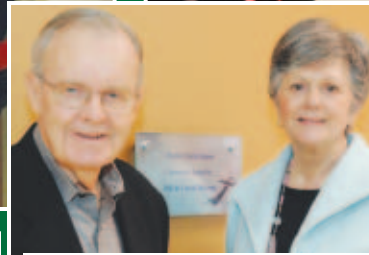
