

Celebrating The Nick & Rosanne Cortellucci Family Emergency Department

July 22, 2008 was an exciting day at York Central Hospital. After many years of planning, hard work and dedication from hospital stakeholders, the first portion of The Nick & Rosanne Cortellucci Family Emergency Department officially opened.

Donors together with volunteer leadership, hospital administration, physicians, staff and government representatives celebrated this momentous occasion on July 16 with a sneak preview.

The new Emergency Department includes a state-of-the-art monitoring system which allows physicians to see lab and x-ray results at the patients' bedsides; a dedicated elevator system so that patients are transferred directly to the inpatient floors from the Emergency Department; and a heated ambulance

bay capable of accommodating up to six vehicles.

To improve the flow and wait times for patients and make the department easier to navigate, areas have been arranged in colour-coded zones. Patients with a critical illness are treated in the

Blue and Yellow Zones, patients who can be cared for sitting in chairs are treated in the Red Zone, while patients with fractures and minor injuries are treated in the Green Zone. After entering a clean, bright and spacious area, patients are assessed by a nurse at Triage and then directed to the zone most appropriate to meet their needs.

"This truly is a community project, built by the community for the people of the community," said Nancy Coxford, Chair, York Central Hospital Foundation. "Donors' investments help to ensure we have the facilities, modern technology and state-of-the-art equipment to assist physicians and staff in delivering compassionate and expert care".

Investing in the Future – YCHF establishes an Endowment

To help ensure our physicians and health care professionals continue to have access to the latest state-of-the-art medical technology, York Central Hospital Foundation has established an Endowment Fund.

"Endowment building is an age-old method that provides stable and consistent support to charitable missions," said Dr. Nicholas Voudouris, Chief, Department of Family Practice, York Central Hospital and Vice Chair, York Central Hospital Foundation. "Not only does it offer our organization the opportunity to creatively honour our donors, but it matches their needs with the needs and goals of the hospital. As our hospital grows, so do our capital requirements not funded by the government. I believe that building a successful Endowment will ensure the foundation's ability to provide long-term funding for leading edge medical technology."

"The Endowment Fund was established using \$1 million of the foundation's reserve funding. It is our goal to continually grow the Endowment so that we build a base of funding for future generations of patients. One way we hope to achieve this is by directing Planned

Gifts not designated for a specific purpose to the Endowment," said Bill Leacy, President & CEO, York Central Hospital Foundation.

Gifts directed to the Endowment are invested in perpetuity, which means that once deposited the capital remains intact. Most of the interest earned is disbursed to the hospital to support programs and services, buy equipment or offer educational opportunities for physicians and staff. The portion of interest not disbursed remains in the Endowment to increase the value of the principal. As the value of the fund increases, so too does the amount of investment income available to disburse to hospital priorities.

An Endowment Fund can safeguard against economic downturns or variances in fundraising efforts and helps guarantee a constant source of funding for the future.

Unlike other donations used to meet current or capital needs, a gift to the Endowment Fund will support hospital programs and services forever.

For every dollar York Central Hospital Foundation receives for a new Minimally Invasive Surgery Suite, the Paul B. Helliwell Foundation will match it with \$3 more, up to a maximum of \$300,000. Just imagine, your \$100

gift would actually be worth \$400 to York Central Hospital.

Minimally Invasive Surgery (MIS) uses sophisticated technology to allow operations to be performed through much smaller incisions than traditional surgeries. Less invasive surgeries mean patients experience less pain, faster recovery times and reduced risk of complications.

Currently, surgeons at the hospital perform Minimally Invasive Surgery in out-dated surgery suites. The result is that not all patients are able to access this advanced surgical technique because of unsuitable facilities and technology.

The new MIS Suite will have "embedded" equipment, such as high resolution monitors for increased visibility. It can display images from miniature cameras that are positioned at the ends of long, slender surgical instruments. Monitors and other equipment will be mounted on ceiling booms that can be easily moved to the most efficient position for surgery. MIS techniques are used for the removal of gallbladders and appendixes as well as more complex surgeries like colon cancer, spleens and hernias.

"Having a state-of-the-art MIS Suite will benefit our entire community. Patients who undergo MIS can be discharged several days earlier, reducing wait times for other patients and reducing costs for the hospital," said Dr. David Weizman, General Surgeon, York Central Hospital.

Ask an Expert – About Mental Health Services

How are services at York Central Hospital changing for people with mental health illnesses?

York Central Hospital was recently designated as a Schedule 1 facility by the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care. This new designation means that under the Mental Health Act, York Central is legislated to be able to keep involuntary patients, who are assessed to be at risk of harm to themselves or

others, in hospital for observation, care, safety and treatment.

At any given time, there are more than 13,300 people living with chronic, persistent, ongoing Major Mental Health Disorders in the area served by York Central Hospital, including Richmond Hill, King and Vaughan. This represents 2.5 – 3% of the local population.

“With the addition of Schedule 1 capabilities, York Central can now help involuntary patients suffering from more complex mental illnesses closer to their homes and loved ones,” says Dr. Peter Zelina, the hospital’s Mental Health Program Clinical Director and Chief of Psychiatry. “Before this designation, involuntary patients with these illnesses were taken to other facilities in York Region and beyond, removing them from their families, their familiar surroundings and from our local community support services which helps them to stay connected and continue their recovery process.”

York Central Hospital works on the recovery philosophy which is based on the belief that people have unique strengths and may live productive

and hopeful lives despite having a chronic illness. Recovery means the reduction or complete remission of symptoms and highlights the concept of managing symptoms, reducing psychosocial disability and improving social function. Recovery is seen as a personal journey requiring hope, a secure base, supportive relationships, empowerment, social inclusion, and development of coping skills.

DID YOU KNOW?

- People with mental illness spend more days in hospital than do people for the treatment of cancer and heart disease combined.
- In 2003-2004, mental illness accounted for one third of all general hospital stays in Ontario. Further, patients with mental illness are more likely to return to hospital within one year of their discharge.
- 90% of suicides have one or more psychiatric disorders at time of death. (Roy 2001)
- Mental Health Disorders account for over \$5 Billion in direct cost to the health care system each year in Canada. ■
